

Updated Funding Levels for SY 2023 -2024

Title IA - \$152, 161, a decrease of \$7,497 (4.9%)

- estimated allocation for 2023 -2024 was \$159, 658
- 2022-2023 allocation was \$165,981

Title IIA - \$11,842, a decrease of \$471 (4.0%)

- estimated allocation for 2023 -2024 was \$12,313
- 2022-2023 allocation was \$13,054

Title IVA - \$12,994 (remained the same)

2022-2023 allocation was \$13,323

Planning for Title I, II, IV in SY 2024 – 2025

- → ARP ESSER funds end 9/30/2024
- → Title I is a 100% Federally funded supplemental education program designed to help children meet the state content and performance standards in reading, language arts, and mathematics. In buildings with 40% or more poverty, LEAs may use the funds to upgrade the entire curriculum of the school and are Schoolwide Programs.
- → Once you stop use of funds for program support, you may not restart use for the same expense the following year.


